

Can fiber optic cables only be used with cold connectors

Fiber optic cables can be used with both cold (mechanical) connectors and other connection methods such as fusion splicing or physical coupling.

Fiber optic cables are not limited to cold connectors. Cold connectors, also known as mechanical joints, involve inserting stripped fiber ends into a mechanical component where they are aligned and held in place, often using a matching liquid to facilitate light transmission. This method is quick, requires no power, and is suitable for field operations, but it typically has higher insertion loss (around 0.2–0.5 dB) compared to permanent methods. Fusion splicing, or hot welding, is another common method where fiber ends are melted and fused together using an electric arc. This creates a permanent connection with very low attenuation (0.01–0.03 dB) and is ideal for long-distance or semi-permanent installations. Fusion splicing requires specialized equipment and professional operation. Physical coupling uses adapters to connect fibers without splicing. This method allows easy installation and removal, making it flexible for network reconfiguration. It supports various connector types such as LC, SC, FC, ST, and MPO/MTP, which can be used with single-mode or multimode fibers. In practice, the choice of connection method depends on the application: cold connectors are convenient for temporary or field connections, fusion splicing is preferred for permanent, low-loss links, and physical coupling is used for modular or high-density network setups. Therefore, fiber optic cables are versatile and compatible with multiple connection methods, not just cold connectors.
