

Methods for connecting fiber optic cables and two pigtails

Connecting fiber optic pigtails to a fiber optic cable is typically done via fusion or mechanical splicing, ensuring a low-loss, reliable optical connection.

Step 1: Gather Tools and Materials

Before starting, ensure you have the following:

- Clean the fiber with alcohol wipes to remove dust and debris.
- Cleave the fiber using a precision fiber cleaver to create a flat, smooth end for splicing.

Step 3: Prepare the Pigtail

- Remove the protective coating from the bare end of the pigtail.
- Clean the exposed fiber with alcohol wipes...
