

Vertical engineering cable tray spacing



Article Overview

For vertical cable tray runs, a minimum vertical clearance of 150 mm is recommended, with cables secured at the top and every 1.5 meters to ensure stability and prevent sagging.

Recommended Vertical Spacing

For vertical cable tray installations, the minimum vertical clearance between trays or from the wall should be 150 millimeters (6 inches). This spacing ensures proper airflow, heat dissipation, and allows for future cable additions or rearrangements, while maintaining structural integrity and reducing the risk of cable interference . Cables within vertical trays should be secured at the top and at intervals of approximately 1.5 meters (5 feet). This prevents sagging, maintains order, and ensures that the weight of the cables does not exceed the tray's load capacity . For troughs or wireways, binding may not always be necessary, but proper support is still critical for long vertical runs.

Support Considerations

- Riser height: Vertical cable risers are typically limited to 20 feet (6 meters) for self-standing trays made of 6-inch deep, 14-gauge hot-dip galvanized steel. Beyond this height, trays must be fastened to walls or columns to resist horizontal forces .
- Load and dynamic forces: When supporting multiple cables, consider the static weight, thermal expansion, and potential seismic or dynamic forces. Complex riser installations may require mechanical calculations to ensure safety .
- Cable type and rung spacing: For small-diameter control or instrumentation cable...
