Overview

Line terminals, typically located at the top of the enclosure, receive incoming service from the utility. These are usually connected to thick black or red wires, each carrying 120V in a split-phase system. What are the Code requirements for protecting wires going into the top of a surface mounted electrical panel?

Do the wires need to be in a conduit from the top of the panel into the ceiling above?

If not, do the wires need to be secured to the wall behind the panel with staples or some other. Always begin with disconnecting the main supply before accessing any enclosure containing distribution components. Inside the service housing, line conductors from the utility feed typically enter through the. Learn how to wire a distribution box step by step! Connection method: Each switch takes a wire from the incoming point and connects it to the incoming end of the switch, or uses parallel connection to reduce the difficulty of wiring. Wiring Direction: Wiring between the main circuit breaker and each branch circuit breaker in the box generally. Option #1 and #2 - Sub-panel main lugs at top of panel. Service wire can enter from side of sub panel or bottom.
